

It requires claims-level data on drug cost reimbursement, dispensing fees, copayments, and the amount charged to the plan sponsor (state). It also requires an itemization of all administrative fees, rebates, and processing charges associated with each claim. This bill also requires third party administrators for state employee health plans to provide similar information to state employees through an explanation of benefits and to provide aggregate data to the state related to the differences in amounts paid to pharmacies by the PBM, charged to the TPA by the PBM, and charged to the state by the TPA.
