

It also allows the pharmacist to change the prescribed quantity or package size if it is not commercially available, relates to a change in dosage form, reflects the intended days supply, or if in the best interest of patient care. This bill allows a pharmacist to complete missing prescription information if there is sufficient evidence to support the change and to extend a maintenance drug for the limited quantity necessary to synchronize a patient's refills. This bill also allows pharmacists to prescribe inhalation spacers, nebulizers, supplies for medical devices (including CPAP machines and insulin pumps), normal saline and sterile water for irrigation, diabetes testing supplies, pen needles, and syringes.
